

## January 2017 Monthly Report

This month we took care of 529 Patients, of whom 110 were unable to pay because of limited financial resources.

Eight patients were helped economically and ambulance service was provided for 6 patients to be transported to Tegucigalpa.

In the dental Clinic there were 158 patients, of whom 59 were unable to pay for their treatment.

In total, the clinic treated 687 patients with 168 unable to pay.

Three clean-up operations were organized and educational talks given in 5 communities.

We took care of a 16 year old boy this month who had dropped out of high school because he occasionally had convulsions and after this happened the other students made fun of him which made him insecure and anxious because he never knew when the next convulsion would occur.

Because he did not have sufficient funds, the father had never had his son examined to find out the source of the convulsions so he had never received treatment.

The clinic helped him economically so that the needed exams could be done and he was referred to a neurologist. Now the patient is being given anti-convulsive treatment which the clinic provides and has had no further convulsions. This helped him to regain his confidence and the young man has re-enrolled in school.

He is a good student and a youth leader in his church.
